Poster to help tannery workers with chemical safety Worldwide Published: 06 September, 2016

TEGEWA, an association based in Germany for Northern European chemical suppliers in the fields of textiles, leather, auxiliaries and detergents, has launched a poster, initially in mandarin, to help tannery workers use and handle leather chemicals safely.

The safety poster was launched by Egbert Dikkers of Dutch leather chemical maker Smit & zoon, and Dr Dietrich Tegtmeyer of Lanxess, during the All China Leather Exhibition in Shanghai on August 31, 2016. The aim is to improve worker education, safe practices and protocols when using and handling leather chemicals in the tannery where chemicals are used.

The first edition of the poster is in mandarin with a series of pictograms highlighting safety guidelines for the safe use of chemicals.

The initiative forms part of TEGEWA's "Responsible Care – our commitment to sustainability" programme to inform and educate workers, including managers, in the tannery environment. TEGEWA, which counts most of the most important German and North European leather chemicals makers as members, aims to produce the poster in a number of major leather industry specific languages in the near future. The posters will be situated on the shop-floor within the tannery.

"Chemical companies cannot take over the responsibility on safety matters in the tannery. However, we can provide a service like this poster to support easy to understand safety guidelines on top of the extensive GHS SDS's sent already", says Egbert Dikkers, Head of CSR at Smit & zoon. "The tannery manager has the option to show a personal commitment on safety by signing this poster as safety must be a normal topic of discussion for improvement within the tannery environment", he added.
